Modul University Vienna is an international private university in Vienna, Austria, offering English-taught Foundation, Bachelor, Master, MBA, and PhD programs. MU is accredited by AQ Austria, and its tourism programs also hold TedQual certification by UN Tourism. The university has two intakes: Fall intake, September start, and Spring intake, February start. Final application deadlines depend on whether an applicant is an EU or EEA citizen or resident, has 90-day visa-free entry to Austria, or requires a visa and residence permit.

Modul University Vienna is an internationally oriented private university based in Vienna. MU offers English-taught programs in business, tourism, data science and artificial intelligence, sustainability, international relations, human resource management and related fields.

4. Tuition and Fee Notes

Tuition fees at Modul University Vienna are charged per semester and vary by program. The official fee schedule is applicable from 2 April 2026 and is reviewed every semester.

The official fee schedule states that tuition fees and other fees are quoted in euros, reviewed every semester, and may be subject to change.

5. Tuition Payment Models

Modul University Vienna offers four tuition payment models.

The official fee document explains that new students are contacted by the Student Accounts team about payment models and that the selected first tuition fee payment frequency applies for the full study program in the absence of individual change requests.

6. Intakes and Final Application Deadlines

Our university provides the opportunity to start your studies 2 times per year. If you are thinking to take a gap after finishing your studies or are completing your degree later, you will not have to wait for the traditional fall intake! MU offers the following enrolment opportunities:

- Fall Intake – Studies beginning in the middle of September
- Spring Intake – Studies beginning in late February

Scholarship note: Early application is strongly recommended for scholarship consideration and to maximize eligibility for available funding opportunities.

7. Scholarships and Funding

Modul University Vienna offers scholarships, grants, and reductions. Availability, eligibility, application criteria, and deadlines may vary and are published on the official MU website.

The official fee document states that scholarships may be awarded at the time of admission, cannot be combined with additional reductions or grants, and are subject to current offers and applicable deadlines on the MU website.

The Early Bird Reduction is deducted from the first academic year's tuition in two instalments of €1,000 per semester.

8. Visa and Residence Permit Timeline

Students who need a visa or residence permit for Austria should begin early. The process may include document legalization or apostille, certified translation, accommodation booking, residence permit application, MA35 review, and Visa D application where required.

Visa D Countries

Students from Visa D countries should follow this sequence:

- Collect, legalize or apostille, and translate documents
- Book accommodation in Vienna (housing support is provided by the university, default options are available)
- Apply for a student residence permit in the home country (support provided by the university)
- Apply for Visa D in the home country (support provided by the university)
- Travel to Austria
- Collect the residence card

The visa document states that legalization or apostille and translation may take from a few weeks to several months, depending on the country. It also states that residence permit appointment waiting times vary by country and may range from immediate availability to delays of up to 4 months.

90-Day Visa-Free Countries

Students from 90-day visa-free countries should follow this sequence:

- Collect, legalize or apostille, and translate documents
- Book accommodation in Vienna
- Apply for a student residence permit in the home country
- Travel to Austria
- Collect the residence card

Students from 90-day visa-free countries may enter Austria without Visa D if they have not used their available 90 visa-free Schengen days in the last 6 months. They must coordinate with the MU visa team to ensure the residence card is collected before their available Schengen visa-free days expire.

Residence Permit Review

Step	Typical time frame
Apostille and translation	A few weeks
Full legalization and translation	Up to a month or several months
Residence permit appointment wait	Immediate availability to up to 4 months
MA35 review if documents are complete	Around 3 months
MA35 review if additional documents are required	Around 6 months
Visa D	Around 2 to 4 weeks

The visa document identifies incomplete documentation as a key reason for longer residence permit processing, extending the review process from around 3 months to around 6 months.

9. Visa Document Checklist

Short Checklist

Students should prepare:

- Supporting Documents
- Application form
- Passport
- Birth certificate
- Police clearance certificate
- Proof of admission to MU, including offer letter, payment confirmation, and payment plan
- Proof of financing, including sufficient funds and proof of origin of funds
- Proof of health insurance in Austria
- Accommodation contract for a minimum of 3 months in Austria

The visa document also states that legalized or apostilled documents may require certified translation into English or German, depending on the country and document type.

10. What Can Delay a Visa or Residence Permit Application?

Common delay reasons include:

Risk	Why it matters
Incomplete documentation	Missing documents can extend the review process from around 3 months to around 6 months
Late appointment	Some embassies have long waiting lists
Legalization delays	Full legalization may take several months in some countries
Accommodation delay	Student dormitories can fill quickly
Missing proof of origin of funds	Funding sources must be documented
Translation issues	Documents not provided in German or English may trigger additional translation requests
Expiration of 90-day visa-free Schengen entry	The application may be affected if students do not leave before their available days expire

The visa document advises accepted students to communicate with the MU visa team and schedule a call to receive guidance on the Austrian visa process.

MSc tuition ranges from €7,000 to €8,000 per semester. The MBA is €11,000 per semester. The PhD is €8,000 per semester.

Can international students work in Austria?

Students may work up to 20 hours per week.

What happens after graduation?

Graduates may benefit from a 12-month post-graduation job search period.
