

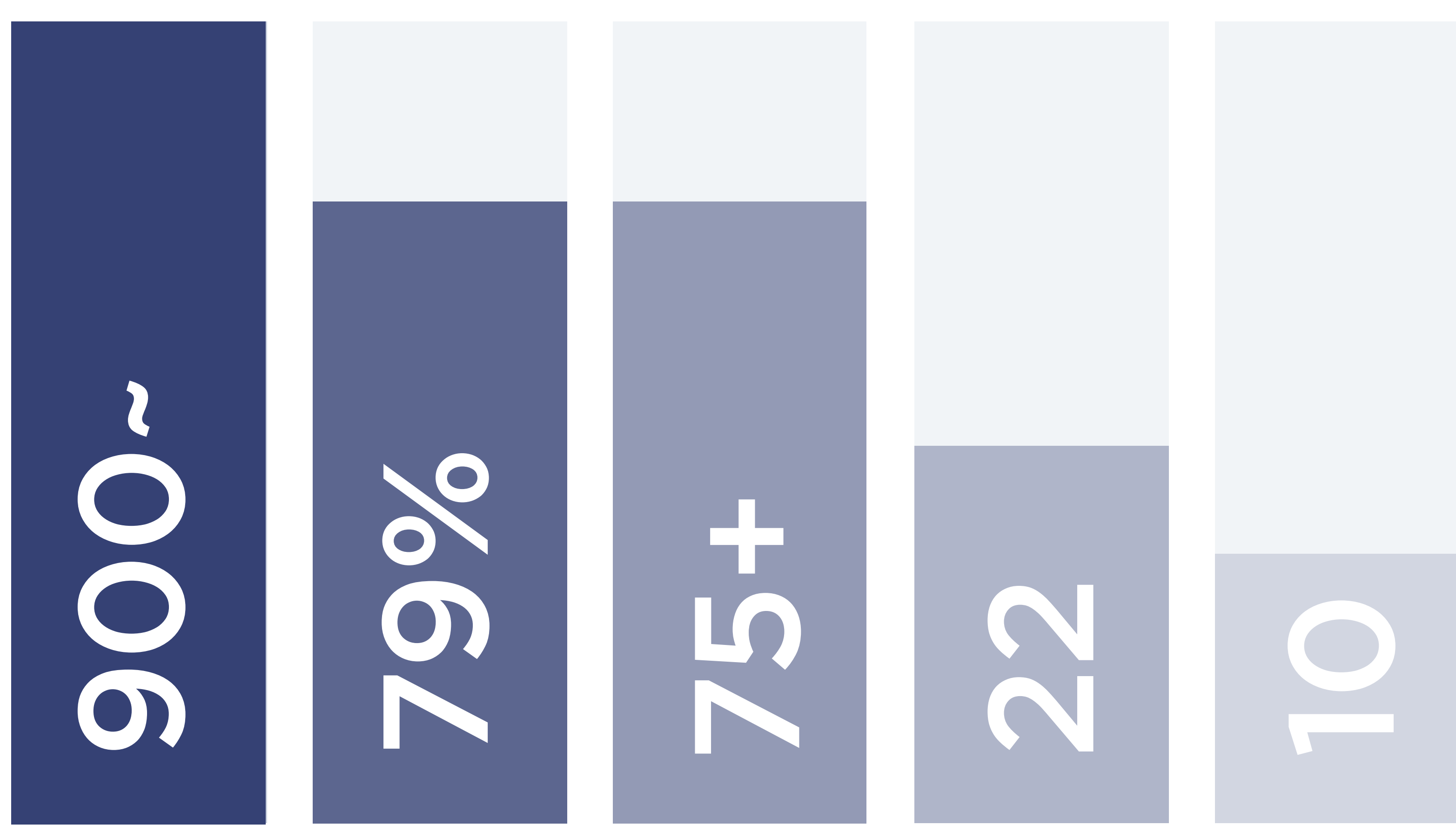

- IT support for students is provided by the Information Systems and Services (ISS) department.



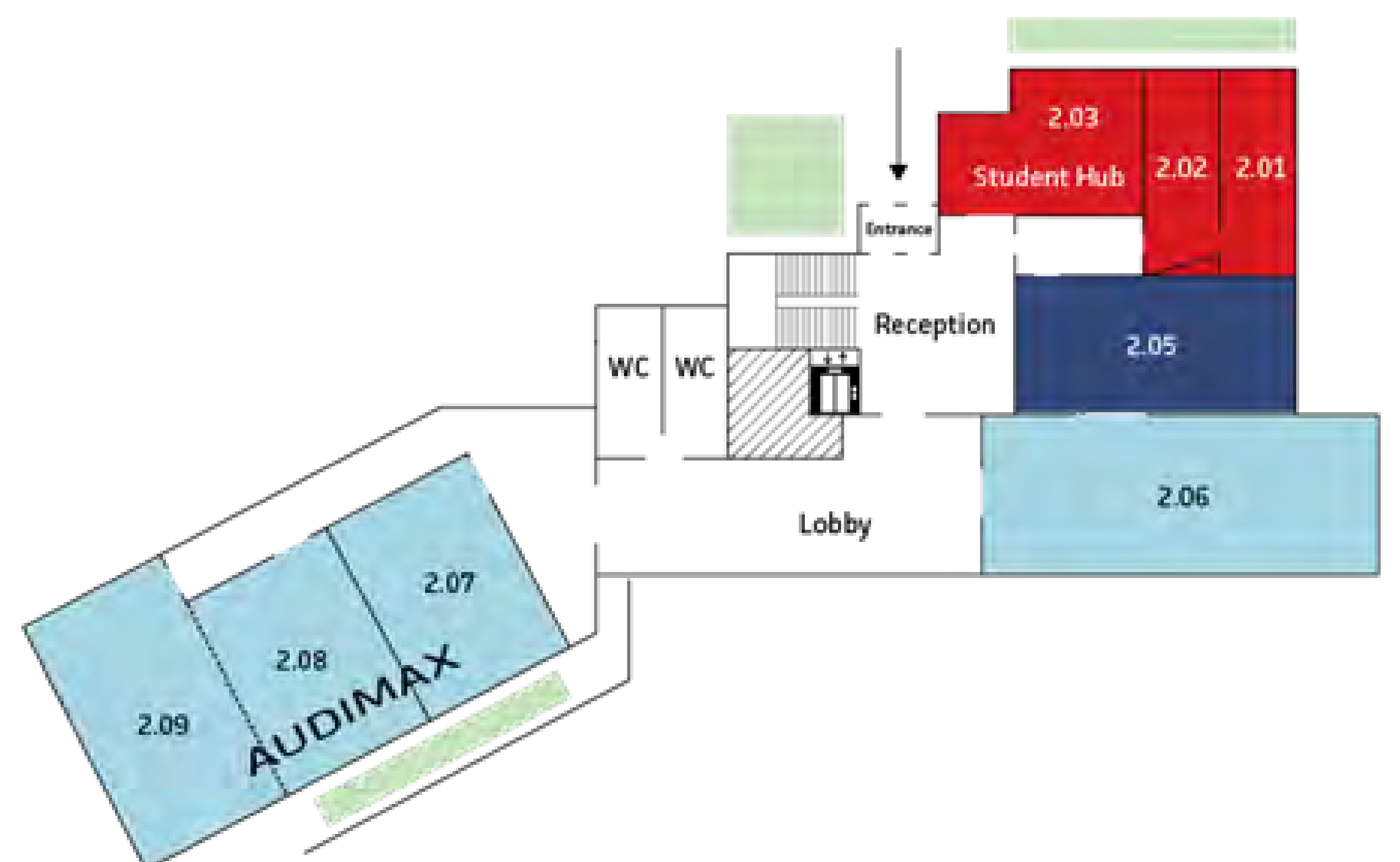

Academic Honesty & Plagiarism

At Modul University Vienna, we are committed to creating an environment that fosters academic and professional growth while maintaining the highest standards of academic integrity.

Honesty and integrity are core values of our community. Any action or attempt to gain an unfair advantage in academic work is considered academic misconduct. This includes plagiarism and cheating, both of which are taken very seriously and can result in disciplinary actions, including expulsion from the university.

Attendance Policy

Attendance is mandatory in all courses at Modul University, except for interactive lectures and the lecture portion of lecture/seminar and lecture/exercise type courses. If you miss more than 20% of mandatory course sessions, you will obtain a failing grade of 0%. When missing course sessions, the ACO strongly recommends that students complete the Special Consideration Form and submit it to your instructor without delay, as late requests are often not considered. Absences are generally only excused for significant issues beyond a student's control (i.e. medical reasons). Note that overlaps with other courses are not considered valid reasons for missing course sessions.

After the official online course registration closes, changes to course registration are only permitted:

- 1) if an extended course registration period has been indicated on your course syllabus (for undergraduate, MSc and PhD courses) / up to two weeks prior to the course for blocked courses in the MBA/MSc programs, and
- 2) if the rules and regulations allow. All requests to change a student's course registration after the official registration period shall be directed to the Academic Office.

A fee applies for each late change. Please view MU's [Guidelines on Fees](#) for further information.

International Mobility (Exchange Programs)

MU encourages international and intercultural diversity and study abroad. Any student can apply for an exchange, but students with a good academic record and extracurricular participation have the best chance of acceptance.

To apply, you need to write a motivation letter and fill out an application. You will then be nominated to be one of our international partners and assisted in selecting your classes by one of our internal liaison officers.

JustIn Mobile App

The **JustInMobile App** grants you access to the campus main door. The app will be configured using the mobile phone number you provided to the university, so check your account to ensure you have shared the correct phone number. Here's what you need to do to use it:

- Download the JustInMobile app on the mobile phone you provided (if you haven't done it already).
- Open the app and confirm your phone number.
- You'll receive a verification code — enter it into the app.
- Once confirmed, the app will grant you access to a Modul University digital key.

How to open the door:

- Make sure Bluetooth is enabled on your phone.
- Open the app and press the green unlock button.
- Hold your phone close to the lock — the door will unlock automatically.

This will allow you to enter the building directly using your phone, with no physical keys needed. For any issues or questions regarding the JustInMobile app, please reach out to our campus receptionist.

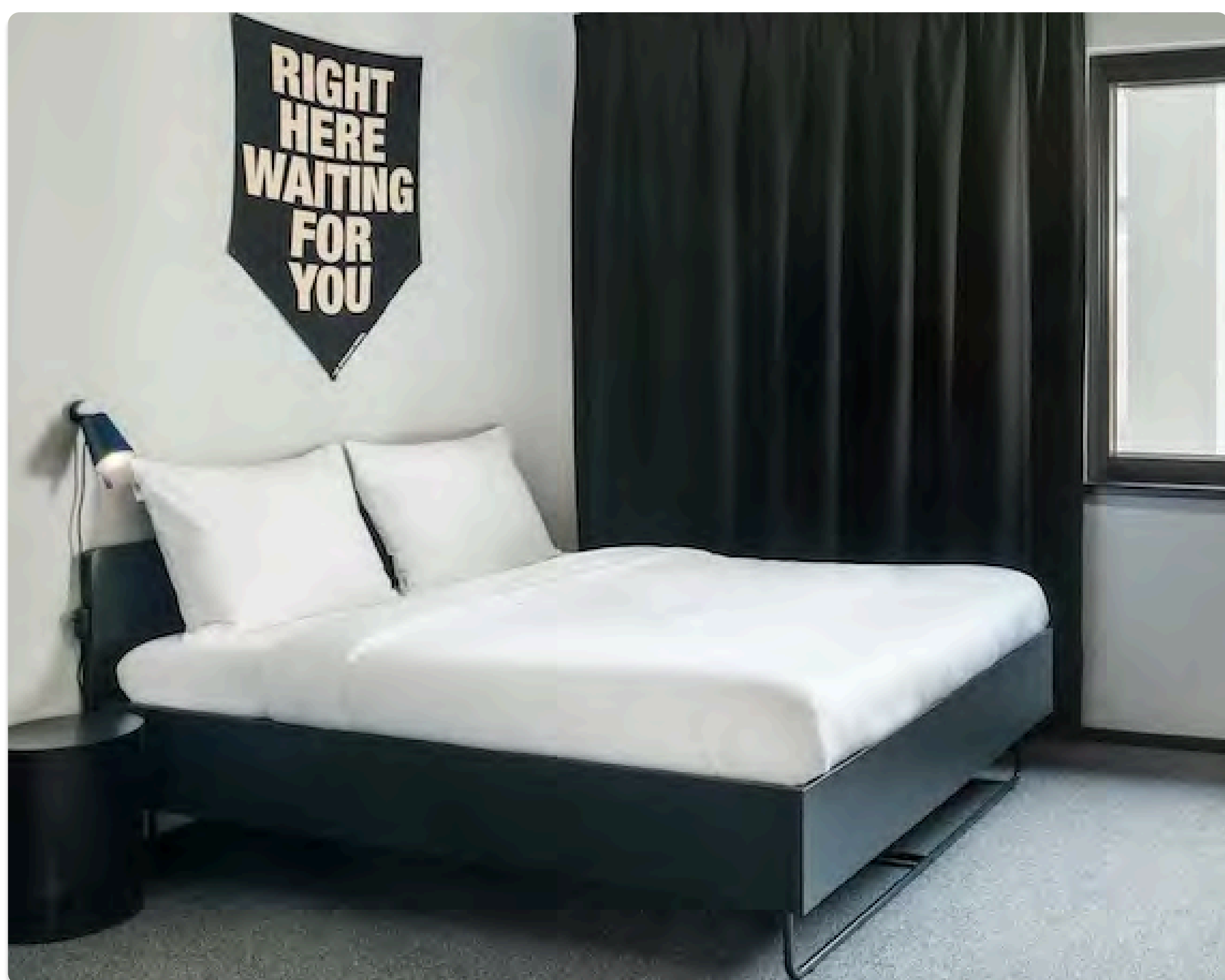

Visa support

Upon arrival in Austria, it is important to register with the local authorities within 3 days of arrival. The Meldezettel ([registration form](#)) which must also be signed by your host (e.g.: student dorm, landlord if you are renting privately) on the bottom left, is the form they are requesting you to bring in. If you are staying in a student dorm, they will (most likely) have the signed form prepared for you upon arrival. In case you have not received it, please contact them.

The completed registration form needs to be taken to the magistrate's office ([Magistratisches Bezirksamt](#)) in your district. You will then receive a computer printout which is your Meldezettel that is used for official purposes (for instance your student visa). Please be sure to scan the document and keep it in a safe place.

Internships

Three- and four- year BBA students, as well as students enrolled in the BSc in International Management with Professional Experience, must complete a mandatory internship as part of their study program. For students enrolled in the BSc Applied Data Science, slightly different regulations apply. Instead of a traditional internship, they are required to complete a professional capstone project amounting to 650 hours. The Academic Office is responsible for the administration of the internship and happily supports you. During your studies you need to complete 900 working hours, domestically or abroad, to be counted towards your internship. These 900 hours can be completed in one part during your internship semester, or in two equal parts of 450 hours duration each. Students will only receive ECTS points for the internship if all steps have been completed on time in the correct sequence. For more information, please contact Yasmin Eder at Yasmin.straube@modul.ac.at. All three MSc programs offer the option to do a full-time OR part-time (min. 340 hours) graduate internship instead of two enrichment courses (6 ECTS). The Academic Office is responsible for the administration of the internship program and, together with the SSC, is happy to support you in your search for a great internship.

The internship can be completed either domestically or abroad within the area of study.

USEFUL INFORMATION

HEALTH INSURANCE

We highly recommend having adequate health and accident insurance. If you are a student from **EU or EEA countries** as well as from Switzerland, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, Turkey, you can prove your health insurance by showing your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) or an eligibility from an agreement country.

If you are a **non-EEA Students**, you are required to hold valid health insurance that covers the entire duration of your study period and must cover all kinds of medical requirements.

In this case you can get insured through:

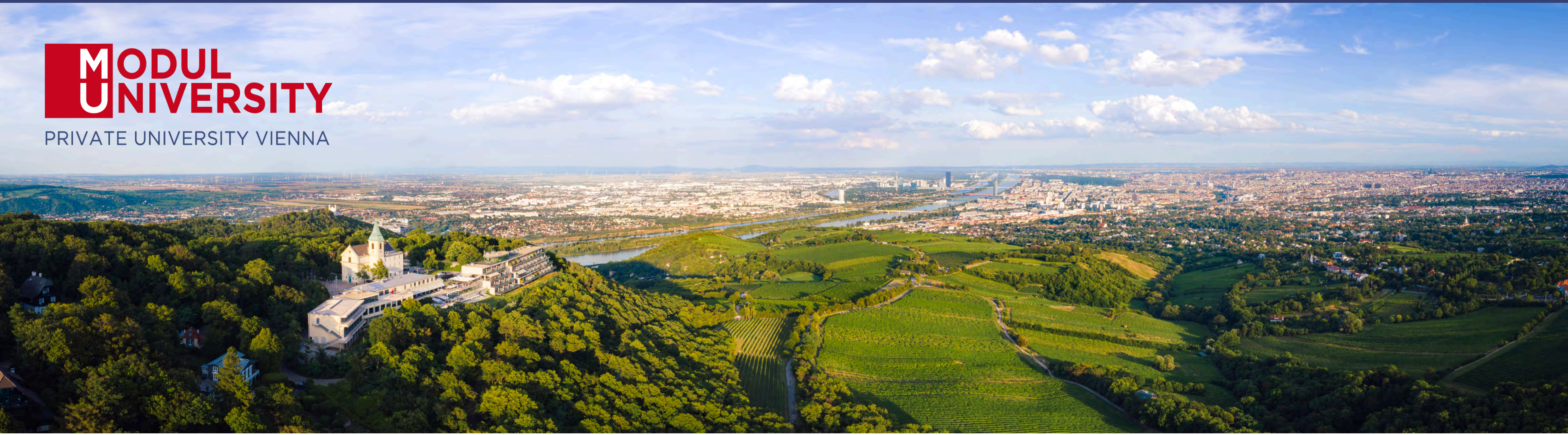
